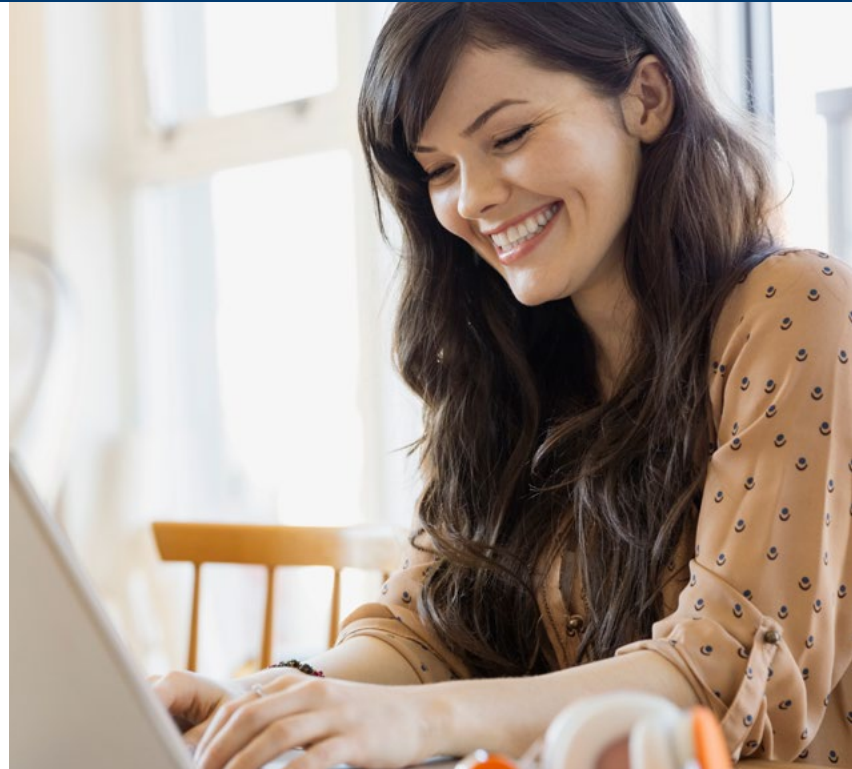

## Become Eligible

Once you apply, a Program Advisor will conduct a personalized one-on-one interview with you about your background, experiences, and your passion for the teaching field. You will then take our electronic screening instrument that helps to evaluate non-academic factors in relation to being in today's classrooms. ### TESTING

Prior to full admission to the program, you will need to pass the applicable Michigan Test for Teacher Certification (MTTC) Subject Area Examination(s) that corresponds to the subject area and certification grade level that you want to teach.

## Start Teaching

Teach for two academic semesters with full pay and benefits as the teacher of record on an Interim Teaching Certificate. Receive ongoing support from your Field Supervisor, your on-campus mentor, and our expert Program Advisors while completing your requirements. Our team comes together to help you grow as an educator and guide you to full Standard Certification.

## YOUR JOB OFFER

- After admission, you will begin working on your initial Classroom Readiness training (93 clock hours for Elementary and Secondary; 90 clock hours for K-12) and 72 hours of field experience projects. The field experience projects can be completed prior to or during your first teaching year.
- After completing your Classroom Readiness training, you will receive your Letter of Eligibility to begin seeking employment. Upon hire, you will fill out an I Got a Job Form to notify Michigan Teachers of your job offer.
- You must successfully pass a Federal Background Check and provide evidence of a current CPR/First Aid certification prior to teaching. Fingerprinting may also be required by some school districts as well.
- Apply and pay for the Interim Teaching Certificate through the Michigan Online Educator Certification System (MOECS) and submit all required documentation.
- We will work with you to set up a monthly payment plan for the remaining program balance.

## YOUR INTERNSHIP YEAR

Your Internship Year will be the first year of employment during the three-year MARITC program. During this first year, you will lead your own classroom as a full-time teacher of record with full pay and benefits. You will be assigned a Field Supervisor and Campus Mentor to provide support, answer questions, and help guide you through any situation that may arise. You will begin teaching on an Interim Teaching Certificate while working towards Standard Certification. The Interim Teaching Certificate is valid for five years from the date of issuance and is nonrenewable. Additional endorsements cannot be added to the Interim Teaching Certificate.

### Requirements during the internship year:

- Teach two full semesters as teacher of record.
- Complete all clock hours of Excellence in Teaching and Learning training and all field experience projects (114 clock hours for Elementary; 102 clock hours for Secondary; 117 clock hours for K-12)
- Up to three classroom observations during the year scheduled with your assigned Field Supervisor.

### At the end of your internship year:

- Your Campus Principal and Field Supervisor each make a certification recommendation regarding your performance in the classroom.
- Successfully complete all performance-based assessments and evaluations.
- Upon successful completion of your Internship Year, you will continue to teach for two additional academic years on the Interim Teaching Certificate to satisfy the three full years of successful teaching requirement for the MARITC program.
- Your Field Supervisor will provide at least two virtual observations per year for the additional teaching years.
- You will receive a Letter of Completion and a Transcript of Coursework completed at the end of the MARITC program.
