

Defining Special Education

Specially designed services and support to meet the unique needs of a student with a disability.

✓ SPED Teachers ensure that the general education curriculum is accessible to students with disabilities.



Special Education Students

Students with disabilities that adversely impact their educational performance.

Individuals with Disabilities Education

Act (2004) identified 13 categories of which
students with disabilities are identified and
deemed eligible for Special Education services.
