- Do use concrete examples to demonstrate your teaching methods and successes. Include brief stories or anecdotes that show your skills and impact in the classroom.
- Do highlight any relevant certifications or training. Especially those specifically valuable or required in the district you are applying to.



What to Avoid

Watch Out for These Common Mistakes

- Don't merely repeat information from your resume; provide additional insights into your qualifications.
- Don't use a generic or impersonal tone.
 Your passion for teaching should come through clearly in your writing.
- Don't overlook the importance of formatting and proofreading. Errors can be seen as a lack of attention to detail.
- Don't write a lengthy cover letter. Keep it concise; one page is typically sufficient.
